

DEVELOPMENT IMPACT FEE ANNUAL REPORT – FY 19/20

**Antelope Public Facilities Financing Plan
Development Impact Fee Program
Basin "A" Drainage Mitigation Development Fee**

Brief description of the type of fee in the fund:

The Antelope Basin "A" drainage mitigation development impact fee was established as a mitigation fee to finance off-site drainage improvements to be constructed in Placer County beyond the jurisdiction of the Sacramento County Water Agency. This development fee applied only to land within a single 760-acre drainage basin in the northern half of the Antelope plan area known as Antelope Drainage Basin "A."

Per the County of Sacramento Department of Water Resources and Placer County staff, no projects in either Sacramento County or Placer County require funding beyond the existing balance in the fund. Therefore the Basin "A" Drainage fee is no longer required and was discontinued with the program update approved by the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors on August 21, 2018. The remaining fund balance will be provided to Placer County to be used for improvements and/or acquisitions downstream of Basin "A" in Placer County.
